Marvin Taylor-Dormond is the Director of the Independent Evaluation Group at IFC (IEG-IFC). The independent evaluation function at IFC is part of the wider Independent Evaluation Group that reports directly to the World Bank Group Board of Executive Directors through Director-General, Evaluation.

Marvin joined IEG-IFC after a successful career in the Central American Bank of Economic Integration in Tegucigalpa, Honduras, where he held positions such as Controller (Independent Oversight and Evaluation Authority), Executive Vice President and most recently Chief Economist and Chief Evaluation. Marvin also served as Vice-Minister of Finance for the Republic of Costa Rica, his native country.

He holds a PhD in Economics from Carleton University and Ottawa University in Canada, an MA in International Affairs from the Norman Paterson School of International Affairs in Canada, and a Lic. and a BA in Economics from the University of Costa Rica.
