She has developed innovative advisory programs on E&S standards in the hydropower sector in Lao PDR, Myanmar, Nepal and Pakistan along with cross-sectoral client-facing ESG programs. She developed and coordinates the ESG Landscape project which carries out upstream assessments to pave the way for private sector investment. She developed the ground-breaking industry-led Hydropower Developers' Working Group in Lao PDR, Myanmar and Pakistan and the Powered by Women initiatives in Nepal and Myanmar to promote gender diversity and equality in the renewables sector. In 2019, Kate was named one of 70 most influential who have had or will have, the biggest influence on the hydropower and dam industry in recent years and in the near future by International Water and Power Magazine. She also received the Top 30 of IFC Individual Corporate Award. She has lived and worked in Asia for 22 years. Kate is a mentor and coach to IFC staff and to Girls in Tech Nepal.
