## Introduction

The Powered Webinar series provides member companies of the IFC Powered by Women Nepal initiative with the tools and resources to build knowledge and network to enable them to achieve their commitments to action on gender equality and diversity.

These monthly, one and half hour, interactive webinars feature key speakers on topics linked to the PbW commitments to action, which include enhancing opportunities for women: in leadership, as stakeholders, in non-traditional jobs, and as employees. The focus of this webinar is to provide a first-hand information to the companies in establishing and effectively managing a GRM with a focus on gender inclusion and thus help them build a respectful workplace for both women and men.

#### **Objectives of the webinar:**
