The SBN Measurement Framework is designed to evolve over time to support members as country experiences and global practices in sustainable finance shift.

Key themes that have emerged or deepened since the 2019 Report:

Climate risk has become an urgent priority, with a need for new risk management practices and disclosure (driven by NGFS, TCFD).

Sustainable finance is moving **“beyond banking”** – growing momentum for ESG investing. More sector-wide approaches emerge that include capital market, pensions, insurance, asset management etc.



Taxonomy – national and regional taxonomies are being developed to provide clarity and prevent green washing (EU taxonomy on sustainable activities)

Financing sustainability – The popularity of green and climate bonds has led to expansion into social and sustainability bonds, and broadening from bonds to loans and other financial instruments

ESG disclosure – The need for data to understand ESG risk as well as opportunity is driving demand for improved disclosure by all parts of the financial sector.

A Member-Led Process: SBN Measurement Working Group (2020-2022)



In October 2020, SBN welcomed the following new Co-Chairs and Members of the Measurement Working Group for the next two years.
